2. Public Comments

Dorothy DeFremery - spoke about the City of Sedro-Woolley not having the approval of the voters to negotiate and questioned about the contract with the City and the location of the library sites. She stated that \$25,000 for an architect is not enough to review more than two sites. She stated that there was a great deal of misinformation out in the community. She would like to see a county library but does not feel that this collaboration would come close to that.

Sylvia Matterand - spoke about the confusion and talking to the Mayor of Sedro-Woolley about a question and answer session. She stated that she is still in favor of collaboration and is saddened by the misinformation being spread. She spoke about the bylaws and attendance, pointing out that one Trustee had missed two consecutive meetings but was unsure if that Trustee had been given an approved leave of absence. She stated that, with such important decisions to be made, if all members can't commit to attend meetings a resignation might be in order.

George Maxfield - Clear Lake resident who feels he has not seen anything for his tax money other than controversy between the Board and the Sedro-Woolley Library. He said that he never received any mailers or correspondence to show tax payers what the Board is doing. He stated that he originally opposed the vote and preferred that he had a choice in buying a card rather than paying taxes. He suggested that the CSLD send a mailer to let residents know what is going on and keep tax-payers abreast of goals and activities.

- 6. Communications: Director pointed out that a state librarian has been hired.
- 7. Report of the Director Attached to June minutes packet. Director pointed out that Clear Lake Elementary has reserved use of the gym for a program. It was pointed out that the Verizon meeting involved getting a business cell phone owned by the CSLD rather than the Director's personal cell phone. The Director and the Verizon representative also talked about the possibility of checking out wi-fi hotspots to patrons and tablets with cellular wi-fi built in since these types of services are beginning to be offered by libraries. To provide a site, the CSLD would have to own property or arrange with a business owner to house a wi-fi site.
- 8. Unfinished Business
 - A. Negotiations with City of Sedro-Woolley
 - 1. Update from May 31, 2012 meeting with City representatives

Report on ongoing discussions with Sedro-Woolley also includes June 6th meeting. Mary Alice led the discussion. In May, the Board discussed issues with 20-year contract could be mitigated by protections written into the contract. The city wants an agreement that matches the term of the bond for the new facility. The negotiating teams discussed how the agreement could end. Annexation (city would have to do) would end the agreement earlier than 20 years so language has to be written in for this. If there is no annexation, at the end of 20 years, decisions will have to be made. If there is no agreement to renew, the city is interested in language that would commit the city to placing annexation on a ballot. If this annexation does not pass, the city has an interest in maintaining a library. The city is interested in contract language that would outline what each party brought to the project so that each party would have equity share in the facility and the collection. At the end of 20 years, if there is no renewal. the city would want first priority in buying out the district and take over ownership of the library. The CSLD could buy out the city if necessary. Lynn stated that he is of the opinion that we need to have a joint library and that the attitude needs to be that all parties want to make it work. Mary Alice stated that the Board doesn't need to react at this point. Ahmik asked for clarification on what would happen if annexation occurred. Annexation would null and void the equity share and if there were still

bond payments due the CSLD would make those payments from the taxes that the CSLD would be receiving directly from the City.

The second part of the discussion at the negotiation revolved around representation of city residents on the Board of the CSLD. The Mayor expressed interest in a formulaic approach to seats on the Board. The CSLD team expressed concern over the large size of the district and that there may need to be a more geographically-based approach. There was some discussion between the teams about going to the County Commissioners with a request based on what is ultimately decided for Board representation.

The third part of the discussion revolved around service hours in the combined library. The Mayor wants to see that there is a minimum level of service to see to it that the combined library offers more rather than less. Mary Alice pointed out that everyone involved wants to see elevated services. However, there needs to be more discussion about what this entails because if there were to be a major economic downturn, levels of service may have to be adjusted due to lower operational income.

2. Phase I of Library Facility Project – Add Team Member

Mary Alice stated that the city has hired an architect and that the CSLD is not paying for this work and had no involvement with the scope of work. However, the CSLD has been invited to take part in this project. Mary Alice pointed out that, without more information on the costs involved with the facility, the CSLD Board cannot make decisions on how to proceed. She feels that this process with SHKS should be given time so that all parties have more information to make decisions. There are currently no negotiation meetings scheduled because we have gotten as far as we can with the information we have until SHKS gets further along in their process. Mary Alice stated that the tone of the meetings has been positive.

Motion to add Chris Silves to team working with city of Sedro-Woolley and SHKS Architects on Phase I of facility project.

Discussion: Mindy asked for clarification as to whether Chris would be added to the negotiation team and Lynn clarified that he meant that he wanted Chris to be added to the architect team.

B. Employee Benefits Update – Process to apply to join PEBB

Starting in July, the PEBB board would no longer be able deny inclusion based on census data from agencies. The second step to joining PEBB would be to execute a resolution and an attestation. Once this is done, the CSLD would submit a census. The PEBB Board could still deny inclusion.

There was also discussion of costs for joining of \$10 per employee and a surcharge, which is a new charge and the representative did not what this surcharge would be. If the CSLD were to be included in the PEBB benefits pool, PEBB would simply send a bill to the CSLD. It is at the discretion of the Board as to how that bill is paid and what percentages the CSLD pays of the healthcare costs. The CSLD would not be getting a subsidy to help cover those costs. The coverage amounts that Lynn and Chris presented in an earlier meeting represent the costs that the CSLD would pay.

9. New Business

A Independent analysis of library facilities costs:

1. Library District capital fiscal capacity - presentation attached

Mary Alice outlined the presentation. The estimates here are based on reasonable assumptions about income and operational costs. Funds are based on the assumption that a project would begin in 2018. All assumptions can be modified as the Board moves forward to consider different scenarios.

Analysis of similar completed/underway library projects relevant to District (AGENDA ADJUSTED TO ACCOMMODATE ARRIVAL OF CONSULTANT)

At the last meeting, the Board decided to engage an architect to help the Board understand what it would cost the CSLD to develop facilities on its own in order to compare that to what it would cost to develop a facility with the City of Sedro-Woolley when their architect completes their study. HKP Architects were engaged for this project. Julie Blazek of HKP Architects provided a presentation and discussion of library facility project costs using comparisons from northwest Washington library projects that are in design phase, are underway or have been completed. She escalated these figures to 2018 costs and provided the Board with estimates of how much square footage the CSLD could afford in three different scenarios based on reserve fund plus bond capacity. Presentation attached.

B. Loggerodeo Discussion

The Board discussed last year's Loggerodeo float and the exposure it gave the library and brought in new patrons. Chris stated that she didn't want to do it again this year. The Director thought there might be an opportunity to be open on that date and will look into it. If feasible, will get a write-up about it to Lynn.

10. Other Business

Chris stated that last year, she and Linda Allen did the promotion to the schools and set-up of the summer reading program. She talked about using the parks in Clear Lake and Lyman as well as an elementary school and Boys and Girls Club. Chris felt that the record needed to be corrected concerning the summer reading issues at the parks and that my statements would give the parks a bad name. She said that no one asked a homeless person to move camp. Lynn stated that he may have moved of his own accord because of the activities. The Director pointed out that Linda Allen had actually gone over and talked with man about the program that was going to be taking place. The Director stated that she did not want to give any park a bad name, but that the report simply stated what happened. After further discussion, Chris stated that she had not

been aware of those problems. Chris further stated that children she spoke with said the librarian from the Sedro-Woolley Library who was contracted to also do promotion for CSLD did not mention the CSLD. She also said that she thought it was unethical if both libraries counted the total number of children who attended the programs on their statistics. She said that the students she talked to had not received any flyers because they were not cleared with the school district. The Director pointed out that the flyers were cleared by the Superintendent but it was made clear that they could not get them out to every child, but would be placed in the cafeterias and libraries. Posters were also placed at every school.

The Board discussed the date of the July Regular Board meeting. There were some scheduling conflicts and the Trustees felt that, with such major decisions facing the Board, all Trustees would need to be present. The Board rescheduled the meeting for Tuesday, August 2nd at 7pm in the Sedro-Woolley City Council Chambers.

Jana and Eron:

We understand your interest in developing a budget range for a library building in Sedro-Woolley. Below is an analysis based on our experience at the WCLS Ferndale Library at Ferndale provides a useful, relevant baseline example; similar in scale to the project anticipated in Sedro-Woolley and reflecting a known level of construction quality. Construction market conditions for Sedro-Woolley are similar to those in Ferndale for both general contractors and sub-contractors.

Unit costs (costs per square foot) were derived from actual contractor costs (including change orders and sales tax) divided by area. These unit costs would apply to libraries ranging between 12,000 square feet to 20,000 square feet. They have been escalated to September 2017.

Site costs assume a relatively flat site with street access, access to adequately sized utilities in the street and conventional spread footings. Costs related to site acquisition, structure demolition, hazardous materials abatement, soil remediation or extensive grading have not been included.

Adaptive reuse of an existing long-span building could result in some cost and schedule savings. The building shell - foundations, floor slab, vertical and roof structure – generally represents approximately 30% of the total building cost. A building conditions assessment would be required to confirm the feasibility of renovation/reuse and to more accurately estimate construction costs. Using unit costs from the Ferndale Library escalated to 2017, (\$312.46/sf), a potential savings of \$53.70 to \$58.70 / square foot could be achievable through the reuse of an existing building. \$312.46/sf x 30% = \$93.70/sf minus \$35 to \$40/sf for seismic and structural upgrades, repairs and modifications to integrate mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems.

Using the more conservative figure, savings of \$53.70 per square foot for an 18,000 square foot building could save \$966,600. Additional cost savings could be realized from reduced demolition and disposal fees (approximately \$60,000) and lowered general conditions for a 2 month reduction in a 12 month construction schedule (approximately \$50,000).

In addition to construction costs there are occupancy costs for FFE, new books/collection materials, moving, computer and security equipment and signage.
